Twenty years ago, urban, rural and Indigenous communities and grassroots groups came together to form a new organization to be led by frontline communities impacted by pollution, racism and injustice. It's mission would be to mobilize community power to win victories that change industry and government policies and practices to protect health and promote environmental, social and economic justice....and Greenaction for Health and Environmental Justice was born.

Our first campaign was to join the Colorado River Native Nations Alliance in peacefully occupying federal land at Ward Valley in the Mojave Desert to stop a proposed nuclear waste dump that would have desecrated sacred sites and threatened the Colorado River. 113 days later, the occupation ended in victory.

Since our first day, we have stayed on the frontlines helping communities win David versus Goliath battles against polluters and government agencies that protect them. From the San Francisco Bay Area to the San Joaquin Valley, the Salinas and Imperial Valleys, Los Angeles. Arizona, Utah, Nevada, New Mexico, Wisconsin, Louisiana, Florida, Indiana, many Native Nations – and in Mexico, Philippines, Japan and Malaysia – Greenaction has helped communities win against all odds.

Your support will ensure that Greenaction can stay on the frontlines, and can keep winning victories and bringing about real change for healthy communities, a healthy planet, and justice for all.
