**As Radioactive & Toxic Scandal at Hunters Point Shipyard Superfund Site Explodes:
Greenaction & Residents to Respond to Latest Revelations of Massive Fraud by
Government Contractor Tetra Tech – and Government Complicity - in Botched “Cleanup”**

US Navy “Community Meeting Open House” starts 5:30 pm

San Francisco, CA – As the government now admits that fraud related to their contractor Tetra Tech's work at the notorious Hunters Point Naval Shipyard Superfund Site in Bayview Hunters Point, San Francisco may likely be far greater than previously admitted, Greenaction for Health and Environmental Justice, Golden Gate University School of Law's Environmental Law and Justice Clinic, and Bayview Hunters Point Community Advocates will hold a press conference Wednesday, January 31, 2018, 5 pm, at 451 Galvez Street, San Francisco.

Speakers will address the latest revelations regarding Tetra Tech's massive fraud during years of “cleanup” of radioactive and toxic waste at the Shipyard, the attempted cover-up by government agencies, and what residents and environmental justice advocates are demanding of government agencies in order to see public health, the environment, and taxpayers' money protected. Speakers will also address plans by the Navy and USEPA to leave high levels of radioactive and toxic waste buried at the San Francisco Bay waterfront, despite rising sea levels caused by climate change.

Speakers will also question why state and federal “regulators” continue to allow Tetra Tech to work at contaminated Treasure Island, and will blast USEPA for giving Tetra Tech an \$85 million contract to work on uranium mine contamination on the Navajo Nation. An update will be provided on the Petition to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission filed last year by Greenaction calling on them to revoke Tetra Tech's national license.

At 5:30 participants will attend the Navy's Community Meeting/Open House at 451 Galvez, San Francisco.
