This will be a full time position, 3 weeks paid vacation, plus medical benefits through Kaiser. Salary range is \$55,000 to \$60,000 based on experience.

This person will lead and coordinate Greenaction's work in Bayview Hunters Point, with a focus on the following:

- Organize and outreach to residents and allies and help lead the campaign to demand full cleanup of contamination at the Hunters Point Shipyard and other contaminated sites around Bayview Hunters Point. Work with our community partners and allies in this campaign. Participate in the new San Francisco Bay Shoreline Contamination Cleanup Coalition;
- Attend and speak out at relevant government and community meetings about environmental health, climate and environmental justice and gentrification issues;
- Co-coordinate our Bayview Hunters Point Environmental Justice Response Task Force;
- Inform residents how to file pollution complaints on www.bvhp-ivan.org;
- Assist with our Youth Environmental Justice Leadership Academy Program;
- Publicize our work, campaigns and projects on social media, mainstream media, Bay View paper
