waste on Buttonwillow!**

DID YOU KNOW?

Buttonwillow is the location of a giant hazardous waste landfill run by a company called "Clean Harbors."

2

Clean Harbors Buttonwillow is a 320-acre commercial hazardous waste storage, treatment, and disposal facility. Toxic chemicals, pesticides, and oil-contaminated soils are dumped in the landfill. Radioactive contamination was also dumped here.

State and county agencies allow Clean Harbors to continue dumping toxic waste with a permit that was issued over 26 years ago in 1996 and expired in 2006 - 16 years ago!

The company wants a new permit from Kern County and the State to keep dumping toxic waste. Let the government know your opinion on the toxic waste dump!

Toxic chemicals can cause cancer, birth defects, and other serious health problems.

The toxic dump, pollution from trucks delivering the toxic waste, thousands of trucks on nearby highways, pesticides, and the terrible air quality combine to create serious health threat for residents.

Both of the toxic waste landfills in California are in low-income, Spanish speaking farmworker communities - Buttonwillow and Kettleman City - this is racism!

"CalEnviroScreen" shows that Buttonwillow residents live in one of the communities most vulnerable to pollution in the State.
