

JOB ANNOUNCEMENT: June 29, 2022 GREENACTION FOR HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

San Francisco Bay Climate & Environmental Justice Organizer/Policy Advocate

Greenaction for Health and Environmental Justice seeks an experienced organizer for a full time Community Organizer and Policy Advocate staff position to coordinate and lead Greenaction's San Francisco Bay Climate & Environmental Justice Campaign that seeks comprehensive and safe cleanup of radioactive and toxic contamination sites along the bay waterfront where rising sea levels and groundwater threaten to inundate and spread contamination into neighborhoods and the Bay.

Job responsibilities:

- Work with our team to implement strategy and organizing activities and coordinate our regional San Francisco Bay Shoreline Contamination Cleanup Campaign.
- Coordinate the San Francisco Bay Shoreline Contamination Cleanup Coalition and work with our coalition partners to support community campaigns and advocate for changes in government policies and practices on addressing the climate change threat.
- Support the campaigns in Bayview Hunters Point, Treasure Island, Richmond, and other communities fighting and advocating for full cleanup of shoreline contamination.
- Engage residents of low-income, working class and communities of color on climate change threats to their health and environment.
- Engage with regulatory agencies, City and County governmental bodies, and elected officials to advocate for policies and practices to address the waterfront contamination threat and related climate and environmental justice issues.
- Attend and actively participate in the Bayview Hunters Point Environmental Justice Response
 Task Force and other community meetings and coalitions that focus on climate change and
 environmental justice issues.
- Develop fact sheets, advocacy materials, toolkits, action alerts, op-eds, blog posts, and social media content for our public education and outreach activities.
- Participate in government regulatory and permit processes regarding shoreline contamination issues including drafting and submitting written comments on "cleanup" plans, monitoring and tracking government "cleanup" plans on the Hunters Point Shipyard Superfund Site and other key sites; testify at public hearings and meetings.
- Participate in grant writing to secure funding from foundations and government sources to support the Waterfront Contamination campaign's initiatives and ensure sustainability.
- Additional duties as assigned.

Qualifications:

- At least 2 years of community organizing, campaign, and/or advocacy experience.
- Strategic thinker with short and long-term program development experience.

- Excellent project management skills with experience overseeing project tracking processes, prioritizing and maintaining project schedules and working effectively under tight deadlines.
- Self-motivated, able to work independently as well as in teams in a dynamic, fast-paced environment.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills and ability to work with diverse residents, organizations, and government agencies.
- Demonstrated commitment to social, racial, and environmental justice.
- Strong proficiency with workplace software including Microsoft Word, Google apps, and similar tools.
- Familiarity with various social media channels such as Twitter, YouTube, Instagram, Facebook.
- Willing to work some evenings and weekends, occasional travel.
- Fully vaccinated against COVID-19
- Bilingual (English and either Spanish or Chinese) a strong plus.
