



Bye, Darling! Stop Polluting the Bayview Hunters Point Community in San Francisco!

Darling Ingredients, an animal rendering plant in Bayview Hunters Point, emits nauseating odors and disrupts community wellbeing. Residents, backed by Greenaction, have been complaining about the noxious odors from this polluter for many years. Now we are escalating the campaign, and protested at their facility on January 4th. This facility alongside the toxic Shipyard Superfund site, concrete plants, diesel truck pollution, illegal dumping, and other sources of pollution all contribute to the cumulative burden the residents face. All Things Bayview, Greenaction, BVHP Mothers and Fathers Committee, and other allies gathered at the Darling facility to demand they shut down this polluting plant and leave town!

Campaign Against Avenal Landfill Heats Up!

Located in California’s Central Valley near Kettleman City, the Avenal Regional Landfill continues to expand, and is now dumping toxic contaminated waste as well as solid waste from far and wide. Greenaction and our community partners are challenging local and state agencies and the Avenal City Council to stop dumping toxic materials and stop the noxious odors from the landfill.

White Mesa Ute Community & Greenaction Escalate the Fight to Stop the Dumping of Uranium and Radioactive Waste at Energy Fuels’ Uranium Mill/Dump in Southern Utah!

White Mesa Utes, Greenaction, and many allies are stepping up the campaign against Energy Fuels’ uranium mill that is turning into an international dump. We are uniting with Navajo community groups and the Havasupai Tribe to oppose Energy Fuels’ new Pinyon Plains uranium mine and the transportation of the radioactive material through the Navajo Nation to then be delivered to the mill next to the White Mesa Ute Community. On February 22nd, Greenaction joined with Navajo and White Mesa Ute people in a protest in Tuba City, AZ on the Navajo Nation.

Laytonville Toxic Contamination Meeting Confirms Community & Greenaction Concerns

For decades, the closed landfills in this rural northern California town have been leaking toxic contaminants onto the Cahto Tribe Rancheria and adjacent neighborhoods. Toxic waste was illegally dumped and toxics and garbage were illegally burned, and residents suffer shockingly high rates of illness and death. At a big community meeting on January 30th, the Cahto Tribe's environmental consultant Dr. Dietrick McGinnis shared his findings with residents, and his investigation confirmed what residents have long suspected: the area was heavily polluted by the landfill operations, and a wide range of toxics are present including dioxins, heavy metals and VOCs. Dr. McGinnis emphasized the importance of holding government agencies accountable and pushing for real solutions. The fight for health and justice continues and Greenaction will continue to stand with residents in this fight for their lives.



Treasure Island is a Toxic Island!

Located in the middle of San Francisco Bay, Treasure Island is contaminated with radioactive and toxic waste from the Navy's operations there and is being gentrified with upscale residential and commercial developments. Formerly unhoused people live next to and likely on top of radioactive and toxic waste. Greenaction continues to challenge the adequacy of state cleanup activities and plans, especially due to flooding threats posed by climate change induced sea level rise and groundwater rise. The Navy conducted radiological activities, testing, and training there, resulting in widespread contamination. The island has a racist history still perpetuated today through forced displacement, gentrification, and environmental racism. Greenaction Joins Native Nations at 27th Annual Celebration of Saving Ward Valley from a Proposed Radioactive Waste dump

Greenaction's Director Bradley Angel and Board members Teri Johnson and Jane Williams joined 200 tribal members at the 27th Annual Ward Valley Victory Celebration and Spiritual Gathering commemorating the victory won by the five tribes of the lower Colorado River (Ft. Mojave, Quechan, Chemehuevi, Cocopah, and Colorado River Indian Tribes), Greenaction, and other allies that defeated plans for a nuclear waste dump in 1998. The epic 113 day Ward Valley occupation was Greenaction's very first action, and we are honored to have been part of this epic, historic victory and to continue working with the tribes today.
