Victory! Plan to Dump Toxic Waste in Garbage Landfills defeated!

Greenaction and the California Environmental Justice Coalition (CEJC) mobilized community and environmental justice groups across the state in response to the Department of Toxic Substances Control's (DTSC) plan to allow the disposal of toxic waste in solid waste landfills. We testified at public hearings on the state's "Draft Hazardous Waste Plan", held rallies, and generated media coverage to pressure the government to drop the reckless plan. We continue to call on the government to work with industry to reduce the amount of toxic waste in the first place, and to develop safe technologies and methods to treat hazardous waste so it is not dumped in landfills or incinerated.

Environmental Justice Youth Leadership Academy Programs in Bayview Hunters Point and Quechan Tribal Lands Coming Fall 2025

Greenaction's long history of successful Youth Environmental Justice Leadership Academies in several communities, including Bayview Hunters Point, ensures meaningful engagement and community empowerment for youth participants. Our Youth Academy Programs have thrived in many communities, building leadership skills, enhancing community advocacy, and growing collective knowledge, and we continue to expand our reach now with the Ouechan Tribe in Southern California. Youth Academy participants will learn about the fundamentals of environmental justice, environmental racism, health impacts of pollution, air quality monitoring, how to advocate for their community, and more. We will continue our annual Youth and Adult Leadership Academies in Bayview Hunters Point and grow our academies in Southern California. Youth leadership and power are critical to fighting for change!



Greenaction at the 10th Annual California Environmental Justice Coalition (CEJC) Conference in Sacramento, California

Over a hundred environmental and social justice organizers gathered for the CEJC Conference in late June. This coalition of almost 100 groups represents thousands of community members across the state of California. Together we share our stories and knowledge, build solidarity, and work collaboratively to change government practices and systems that target, pollute, poison, and dismiss our communities. The conference ended with a rally and meeting in the CalEPA building, holding the government officials accountable to protect the health and safety of our environment and communities of California.

Greenaction and Bayview Hunter Point Community Groups Work Together to Stop the Proposed SF Gateway Project by Prologis

The SF Gateway Project proposed by Prologis in Bayview Hunters Point is a large-scale industrial development that would include additional large diesel trucking and manufacturing in a neighborhood already exposed to a plethora of stationary and mobile sources of pollution, including the Hunters Point Naval Shipyard Superfund Site, that negatively impact the health and safety of the community members and the environment. Greenaction, Bayview groups, and allies stand together to say, No More Pollution!



Save the Date for the Annual White Mesa Ute Community Spiritual Walk and Protest

Greenaction continues to strongly support the people of the White Mesa Ute Community of the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, as we help mobilize the White Mesa Ute Community Spiritual Walk and protest against the Energy Fuels uranium mill, which poisons the land and community by processing radioactive waste from around the world. Join us Saturday, October 4th in Southern Utah to defend the environment, local communities, and sacred land from radioactive contamination. Greenaction and the White Mesa Ute community need your support to shut down the mill and clean up the mess it leaves behind.

Greenaction is Holding Government Agencies Accountable with the Community Group Never Again Moss Landing

Impacts from the lithium-ion battery fires from January and February in Moss Landing, California, continue to have negative impacts on the surrounding communities and environment. Greenaction is sharing our knowledge and decades of experience holding government agencies accountable to assist the volunteer-run group, Never Again Moss Landing, connect with government officials, ask questions directly, and share community data. Government agencies responsible for protecting public health and the environment can not allow polluting and hazardous industries to sacrifice the safety of the environment and surrounding communities.

Ongoing Fight Against the Avenal Landfill Continues in the Central Valley

Avenal is a California Central Valley community that has long been impacted by noxious odors and air pollution from the Avenal Landfill site and operations. Toxic diesel emissions and pollution from dumping are right next to small businesses and neighborhoods. Greenaction has been working hard alongside the residents of Avenal by engaging in local city council meetings, joining local events, and making sure air quality reports are turned in to the Air District.
