



Greenaction & Bayview Hunters Point Residents Challenge Polluters, US Navy, and Government Agencies: Our Health is Not for Sale!

The campaign by Greenaction and residents demanding a full cleanup of radioactive and toxic waste at the Hunters Point Shipyard Superfund Site has erupted again as the Navy admitted that plutonium was detected in the air. Our campaign has forced the Navy and government agencies to finally consider the scientific reality that climate change-induced sea level and groundwater rise will flood and spread contamination unless it is properly cleaned up. Our lawsuit and campaign are keeping the pressure on! Greenaction continues our work with All Things Bayview, BVHP Mothers and Fathers Committee, and allies to demand a safe cleanup and to fight Prologis' proposed industrial facility that would add to the harmful pollution.

Greenaction & Quechan Tribe Launch New Air Quality Campaign

Over the last few years, we worked with the Quechan Indian Tribe and helped defeat two cyanide leach gold mine projects proposed near Winterhaven, California. We are now starting an air quality project with the Tribe and the grassroots tribal member organization Ah Mut Pipa Foundation. Our project includes community air monitoring, Youth and Adult Environmental Justice Leadership programs, community education and civic engagement on air pollution issues including mining, diesel truck emissions, and pesticide exposure.

Greenaction Youth Academy Program Expands!

We are excited to announce that Greenaction's Youth and Adult Environmental & Climate Justice
Leadership Academy programs are expanding. As we continue our leadership building programs in Bayview Hunters Point, San Francisco and the White Mesa Ute Community in Utah, we will be holding Youth and Adult academies in Avenal in California's Central Valley, and at the Quechan Indian Tribe located along the Colorado River in California and Arizona. These programs empower residents to have the knowledge, skills, and confidence to be effective activists and leaders in their communities impacted by pollution.



On the Frontlines with Ute Mountain Ute Tribe & White Mesa Ute Community: "Stop Energy Fuels' Uranium Mill/ Radioactive Waste Dump in Utah!" Greenaction staff and board members joined with the Ute people and allies in October for the annual White Mesa Spiritual Walk and Protest against Energy Fuels' facility that is becoming an international radioactive dump. We continue our intensive support for the White Mesa Ute Community and for the Navajo/Dine, Havasupai, Pueblo, and other indigenous people in their campaigns to stop more uranium mining and to get contamination cleaned up properly.

Collaborating with Academic Research to Screen and Score Bay Area Sites for Increased Contaminant Exposure from Groundwater Rise

Buried contamination can be mobilized and spread by sea level rise and groundwater rise, but it doesn't all move toward the Bay; Contaminants like Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) can become airborne and travel through underground infrastructure into indoor air. Greenaction has partnered with researchers from the University of Berkeley and the University of Santa Cruz to study how shoreline contaminated sites in the Bay Area are vulnerable to groundwater rise mobilizing buried VOCs, leading to indoor air pollution. Our project report and community deliverables will be public by the end of the year.



Stop Pollution from the Avenal Regional Landfill!

The mostly Latino/a and Spanish-speaking residents are demanding an end to air pollution, noxious odors, and rat infestation from the giant Avenal Regional Landfill in California's Central Valley. Every day hundreds of diesel trucks pollute the air and dump garbage and contaminated materials at this landfill located next to low-income housing and community businesses. Greenaction mobilized 30 residents to travel to Sacramento in November and joined with allies in a successful effort to get the state Air Resources Board to strengthen pollution rules.

Defend Democracy, No Kings! Power to the People!

Greenaction stands strong in defending justice, democracy, human rights, and the environment from the trump administration's attacks on our communities and families. We will never back down to the oppressive and racist systems rooted in US policy and practices. Cahto Tribe members and other Laytonville residents continue to suffer shocking rates of cancer and other illnesses from the old Mendocino County, California landfills where toxic waste was illegally dumped and burned for years. We are continuing our support for the Tribe and other residents as we work to hold government agencies accountable and to get residents out of harm's way.
