**US District Court Hearing on Greenaction's Lawsuit Against US Navy
Alleging Inadequate Cleanup of Contamination at Hunters Point Naval Shipyard Superfund Site
in Bayview Hunters Point, San Francisco**

Bayview Hunters Point Residents to Rally in front at 9:30 AM before the court hearing

San Francisco, CA – A hearing on Motions for Summary Judgment filed by Plaintiff Greenaction for Health and Environmental Justice and Defendant U.S. Navy will be held on Thursday, February 26, 2026 at 10 am in the U.S. District Court for California, Northern District, 450 Golden Gate Avenue,, 17th Floor, Courtroom 4, in the case *Greenaction for Health and Environmental Justice v. United States Department of the Navy*, Civil Case No 3:24-cv

Greenaction members and supporters from Bayview Hunters Point will rally at 9:30 am in front of the building before the hearing begins.

Greenaction filed the federal lawsuit on June 28, 2024 to challenge the Navy's inadequate and incomplete cleanup of contamination at the notorious Hunters Point Naval Shipyard Superfund Site in the Bayview Hunters Point neighborhood of San Francisco. The suit primarily concerns the radioactive contamination at the Shipyard. In the early 1950's, the Navy used the site to decontaminate ships contaminated with radiation from nuclear weapons tests in the South Pacific. The Navy also operated a once secret radiological lab at the Shipyard. The Navy's reckless practices resulted in radiation and toxic contamination to be spread throughout the Shipyard, which was placed on the federal National Priorities List/Superfund in 1989 by the US EPA.
